What are your goals and aspirations for this World Cup?

Our team has been placed in a very challenging group for this World Cup. However, our goal is to concentrate our energies on each match, in striving to emerge victorious and advance in the tournament. This group is quite competitive, so anything could happen in the group stage. While we will naturally be playing to win, it is impossible to triumph only with the strength of sentiment. If we can play up to the full potential of our skills and what we have accomplished to date. I believe we can produce solid results. The Japan national team has assembled truly outstanding members for this tournament, and I have no concerns in that regard. I am fully confident that our team could perform well, and we have come here with that purpose in mind.

How is your preparation for the World Cup?

We could have training camps as we requested with the full support from the Japan Football Association. Those efforts have included solid strengthening on the physical level, with all preparations proceeding right on schedule.

What are your impressions of three opponents in the group stage – Poland, Tahiti and Brazil?

Our first match is against Poland, the team that appears extremely tough physically. Their players are also highly skilled, and the contest promises to be a stiff challenge. Next is Tahiti, a squad with a similar playing style to Japan. When we had two games with the Tahitians last year, we managed to win both matches. We think that we should be able to play well against them again. Although we have no doubt that Brazil is clearly a team with tremendous strength, we have had opportunities to win in the previous occasions. If everyone in our team plays with confidence and shows

their best performance, I'm sure we can excel against the Brazilians.

Where would you position Japan in the global ranking?

There is no doubt that Japan is among the top 10 national teams. However, it doesn't guarantee that we can beat any of the other sides. Every match promises to be a tough one.

In what areas does Japan shine, and what does Japan need to improve from here on?

Our teamwork is exceptional, and the individual players have high-level technique in the world. I would rate the skills of Moreira Ozu as being somewhat above the rest of our team, although everyone else brings the same basic level of aptitude to the pitch. As a team, therefore, we are able to constantly perform at a very high caliber. After we had experienced the World Cup Asian qualifiers, I thought we need to start with improving of our physical ability and we have prepared for it with the training camps.

What do you think about the current global trends of beach soccer?

Today almost all beach soccer national teams adopt the strategy of using a goalkeeper. The general approach is to add the goalkeeper in 2-on-2 situations to provide a numerical advantage.

Reflecting on your holding of beach soccer clinics in Japan, what impressions do you have of this country and its athletes?

We have received warm welcomes wherever we go in Japan, with every possible effort made to furnish clinic-friendly environments. Japan is a truly beautiful country. While the caliber of beach soccer players differs from region to region, the clinics have been effective in discovering athletes with excellent skills.
